**NSAA Elects New Executive Committee,

Lexington, KY – June 16, 2026 – Members of the National State Auditors Association (NSAA) have elected a new Executive Committee. The election was held on June 11 at the NSAA Annual Conference in Tacoma, Washington, during a business meeting of the members.

South Carolina Legislative Auditor Earle Powell was elected to serve as president from June 2026 through June 2027. Arizona Auditor General Lindsey Perry and Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury Jason Mumpower were added as the newest members of the governing group.
